## The Best Person

The best person to negotiate the deal will be available next week.

"The best person to negotiate the deal" becomes a block – the means of determining the "best" person.

He wanted the best person to negotiate the deal

This could be understood as

He wanted (the best person to negotiate the deal) to negotiate the deal.

We can distance "best" from the criterion.

He wanted the best person to be used in negotiating the deal.

He wanted the most expensive material to be used.

He was the best person we had to negotiate the deal.

Need to terminate the relative pronoun clause.

The adjective needs to become more active in determining the shape of the sentence.

He was the only person we had to negotiate the deal.


Not just adjectives.

He was the best person we had at negotiating deals.

Similar effect with preposition/participial.

He is one of the few people we have who are capable of negotiating this deal.


Member of a group.



## The Better Person

Fred is better than Joe at negotiating agreements.

Fred is better at negotiating agreements than Joe.



Fred is better at negotiating agreements, while Joe is better at executing them.
